


March 2025 Newsletter

Rector's Reflection

Prayer - "Lord, teach us to pray" (Luke 11:1)

I'll be honest; I don't find prayer easy. The truth is that prayer is difficult for most Christians. Why? Because prayer requires effort. It means *exercising* faith, humbly offering ourselves to God, confessing our sins, making petitions, and giving thanks for God's mercy. Prayer is a discipline. And, like any kind of exercise or discipline, it's easy to get stuck in a rut. Far too often, prayer can become a duty, not a delight.

Yet we are promised so much in prayer! "Ask," invites Jesus, "and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened unto you." (Matthew 7:7)

Prayer is (or, at least, should be) an awe-inducing, personal,



and intimate encounter with God. If we truly grasped *why* we pray and *what* is on offer when we do, we'd surely pray more readily, joyfully, and easily.

That is why, in the coming months, we're going to fill ourselves with a diet of the Bible's

promises in *prayer*. Beginning on 2nd March, I'll be teaching on prayer at Adult Sunday School. And, throughout Lent, we're going to exercise our spiritual muscles and practice prayer together. This will include four *Lenten Prayer Meetings in Church* – on different times and days to accommodate all.

LENT COURSE

This year's Lent Book is "Forty Women" by Ros Clarke, looking at unseen women of the Bible from Eden to Easter. The Home Groups will all be using it and a copy of the book will automatically be ordered for each person in the group. If you would like to join a Lent Group or would like to use the book independently please sign the list at the back of the church so we can order a copy for you.

There are 40 chapters in the book, although they include slightly more than 40 women because some are considered in pairs or small groups. If you follow Lent from Ash Wednesday to Maundy Thursday, remembering that Sundays are not included, you will have a chapter for each day. At the end of each chapter are questions and a prayer.

This is quite different from last year's course but I hope you enjoy it!


As we spend time with these women, may we grow in knowledge and love of the Lord.
